BACKGROUND

The International Council of Community Churches' Jordan Scholarship Fund was established in 1960 in memory of Helen Moucey Jordan, a major national leader in the Women's Christian Fellowship (WCF), and in honor of her husband, Ralph W. Jordan, the first treasurer of the Council and the first layperson elected its president.



The Jordans gave wise and dedicated leadership to the Council and to their home church, the First Community Church of Columbus, Ohio.



The Scholarship Fund is a fitting way to continue their positive witness by providing support for educational opportunities.



WHO CAN APPLY?

High school seniors or older adults seeking to further their education who are in need of financial assistance may apply.



Applicants must be active members of a Community Church in good standing with the International Council of Community Churches.



Applicants must submit:

- an application form,
- proof of need,
- 2 letters of recommendation (one must be from a pastor of an ICCC member church),
- grade transcripts, and
- education and career goals



Applicants may obtain an application through the ICCC office. There is no application fee.

Maximum scholarship amount currently available is \$1000 per year per student.



HOW CAN I HELP?

The Fund is totally dependent on donations. Individuals, women's groups, churches, and centers can participate in supporting the Jordan Scholarship Fund by:

- direct contributions (tax deductible),
- designating the Fund in a church's mission or benevolence budget,
- naming the Fund in a will, or
- creating a named scholarship through a major gift.



THE JORDAN SCHOLARSHIP FUND...

is a designated fund of the International Council of Community Churches for the purpose of financially assisting individual students seeking to further their post-high school education through a degree or certification program.
